Preface

These arrangements came out of my work with group class in the Toledo Symphony School of Music Suzuki Program. Periodically, we combine classes of different levels. The usual performance approach is to play through the Suzuki repertoire. When the younger students have not learned the next pieces, they sit down and listen to the more advanced students perform. I thought the students would both enjoy and learn from playing together in ensemble, with each playing parts within his/her technical grasp.

Since note reading and ensemble playing pose additional challenges, I have made the parts, especially for the Pre-Twinkle and early Book 1 students, quite basic. These parts may be learned by rote. The "Twinkle" parts for early beginners consist entirely of open strings. The Violin Book 1 parts are designed for students who have completed at least the first half of Suzuki *Violin School*, Book 1. These parts contain low and high finger reminders to assist the students. The advanced violin part extends to fifth position and is optional. The first violin part requires knowledge of third position, while the second violin part remains in first position. The cello part extends to fourth position. The range of the viola part remains in first position but contains optional fingering utilizing third position. There is a third violin part which may be used if there are not enough violas in the ensemble. A piano part is included for rehearsal purposes and is optional for performance. Extra parts are available for purchase.

The *Three B*'s is intended to introduce your students to the styles of Bach, Beethoven and Brahms, using quotes from some of their most famous works, and mashing them together in a unique, enjoyable musical setting.

I hope these arrangements fill a gap in available repertoire for mixed-level school and Suzuki groups. I have found them successful in my own teaching. I have chosen quality repertoire as I feel it improves the student's musicianship at all levels when the repertoire offers musical challenges.

I hope you and your students will enjoy these arrangements.

About the Arranger


Dr. Steven Kruse has more than thirty-five years of experience as a professional musician, educator, and arranger.

As a performer, Dr. Kruse has served as principal violist of the Kansas City Symphony, Kansas City Camerata, Windsor Symphony, and Flint Symphony. He has performed as soloist with orchestras in the United States, Canada, Romania, and Vietnam, and additionally has presented concerts in Taiwan, Germany, England, Poland, Italy, Israel, and South Africa.

As an educator, Dr. Kruse served as string specialist in the Ohio and Brooke County Public Schools in Wheeling, West Virginia, has conducted orchestras in West Virginia, Michigan, Missouri, Kansas, Ohio, and Vietnam, and has served on the faculties of the University of Missouri—Kansas City Conservatory of Music, the University of Notre Dame, the University of Toledo, Bowling Green State University and West Virginia University. He has written articles for the American String Teacher, The Strad, and the Journal of the American Viola Society. He has served as treasurer for both the American and International Viola Societies. Dr. Kruse has performed and presented at conferences for the American String Teachers Association, the American Viola Society, the College Music Society, and the National Association of Music Educators. He teaches Suzuki Violin and Viola through the Toledo Symphony School of Music.

Dr. Kruse began his studies at the University of Southern California. He earned the Bachelor and Master's Degrees from Manhattan School of Music, and the Doctorate from Ball State University. His principal teachers include Lillian Fuchs, Milton Thomas, Robert Slaughter, Robert Becker, and Lynne Ramsey.
